TANGER MED JOINS THE WORLD'S LARGEST PORT HUBS TO MAINTAIN **INTERNATIONAL SUPPLY CHAIN**

Tanger Med, a world port hub, is partnering with the Port of Singapore initiative alongside the world's major port hubs, such as Busan, Shanghai, Rotterdam, Antwerp, Long Beach etc, and co-signs an international declaration for the maintenance of international supply chains.

Through this initiative, Tanger Med in its capacity as 1st African and Mediterranean port hub, reasserts its commitment to ensuring the distribution of intercontinental logistics flows.

The signatories of the declaration, who met by Visio conference, took note of the recommendations of the IMO (International Maritime Organization) for maintaining the flow of maritime flows, especially for vital and basic necessities, and affirmed their commitment to work closely together to share ideas, experiences and best practices in order to ensure operational ports, support world trade and combat the spread of COVID- 19.

DECLARATION BY PORT AUTHORITIES ROUNDTABLE (PAR) MEMBERS IN VIEW OF THE GLOBAL COVID-19 SITUATION (UPDATED ON 29 MAY 2020)

Members of the Port Authorities Roundtable¹ (PAR) recognise the COVID-19 pandemic as a serious global crisis that has far-reaching impact on many fronts, including global trade. As more than 80% of goods are transported via sea-lanes, we recognise that the port and maritime sector play a crucial role in keeping trade flows open in our global fight against COVID-19.

We also acknowledge the recent Statement made by International Maritime Organization (IMO), emphasising the importance of minimising the disruption to maritime trade and shipping activities so that vital goods, especially necessities and essential medical supplies, can continue to flow seamlessly across different regions in the world. No one country can win the fight against COVID-19 on its own without having continued access to these vital goods in our inter-connected world.

As a multilateral platform² consisting of leading port authorities across Asia, Oceania, Middle East, Africa, Europe and America, members of the PAR would like to declare a commitment to collaborate closely, through the sharing of best practices and implemented measures, such that the ports remain open to seaborne trade to help sustain the world and support the fight against COVID-19.

We therefore are committed to work together and strive to:

- i. Keep global supply chain and trade/cargo going, and that merchant ships can continue to berth at terminals to carry out cargo operations.
- ii. Facilitate closer coordination by establishing an open communication channel so that like-minded port and maritime authorities can share experiences/exchange information in combating COVID-19 while safeguarding unimpeded maritime trade.
- iii. Continue to adopt best practices according to national circumstances, including precautionary measures for shipping community, advisories and assistance for shore personnel and ship crew, safe handling of cargoes and measures taken in dealing with COVID-19 cases.

Finally, we would also like to express our deepest appreciation to seafarers, harbour pilots, shore-based workers and the maritime community who have worked tirelessly amidst the on-going pandemic in enabling international trade to continue during these challenging times. Together, we can do our part to help the world defeat COVID-19!
